

New Year Plans



Let me start by wishing you a happy new year!

When January rolls around, many like to plan the year ahead out. It helps them look forward to the big events in 2025. Those people are the organised ones. They start to fill in their shiny, new diary (I'm thankful for the digital calendar as I know I'd end up losing a physical

one!). Each milestone and family occasion goes into the diary. Special events, anniversaries, and birthdays are all filled in. The holidays are carved out. Before too long, their diary starts to look full.

Well, whether you're organised or not, the start of the year is a natural time to make plans.

However, whatever your plans for the year ahead, whether it involves picking up new habits or hobbies, or simply flooding the calendar with events that you look forward to, it's important to remember the following important truth. When we plan, we can know that we are already part of a bigger plan. It's a much better plan too.

For I know the plans I have for you, declares the LORD, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future. (Jeremiah 29:11).

Aren't those words beautiful?

They were written to the people of Israel who were in captivity in Babylon. The book of Jeremiah details the judgment that God's people faced as a result of their sin. That's why Jeremiah is known as the weeping prophet. Have you ever visited the Sistine Chapel? There you would have seen Jeremiah, painted by Michelangelo, in a posture of anguished lament.

Indeed, so horrendous was the plight of God's people, Jeremiah was told not to marry and have children. And yet, in the book of the weeping prophet, we have those beautiful words above. Despite the rebellion of the people against God, despite the pain of their current situation, despite the captivity that would last 70 years, God's plans for his people were good.

Maybe there will be challenges for you in 2025. Maybe the feeling of exile in this world will grow. However, whatever dark valleys we walk through in 2025, we can be aware that God's plans for us are good.

So, what are the plans that God has for those who trust Christ?

He has *plans to prosper you and not to harm you.*

Sometimes we need to keep reminding ourselves of the simplicity of the gospel message.

God is really like Jesus. It is Jesus who fully reveals who God is. He does not want to harm you. God is not out to get you. He's not looking to trip you up. He loves you. He wants to prosper you.

If we need proof of that, the Apostle Paul reasons in this way, He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all—how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things? (Romans 8:32). If our heavenly Father gave his only Son for our salvation, can we really doubt his plans to prosper us?

He plans to give you hope and a future.

Biblical hope is solid and secure because it's based on Jesus, not us. This hope is not pie in the sky thinking. In other words, it's very different from the hope I have as a Man Utd fan. Christian hope can be trusted. It's a hope that will come to pass. It's hope that is based on an event of history, the resurrection of Jesus. Because of Jesus, we can have an indestructible hope, even when things may seem hopeless.

There is a future too. We get foretastes of the abundant life that Jesus offers us here and now. We taste the grapes from Caanan. But the full enjoyment and pleasures of the land lay ahead of us. This verse in Jeremiah shows how God's plans are future oriented. No matter how bleak the present looks, the Christian can always say there is a good future ahead. As Jesus is the resurrection and the life, even death cannot prevent us from enjoying this future that God has for us. This is a future with him where there will be no more tears, or pain, or death.

As you live in Babylon (this world that is opposed to God's rule) please remember that whatever plans you may have in 2025, God has a plan for you. In Jeremiah's day, God brought his people back from captivity. We too are offered forgiveness from sin and freedom from that captivity. We are offered a hope and a future. So, let's remember God's good plans for us in 2025.



Hot water bottle injuries soar

You might think that there is nothing more comforting than a hot water bottle. You would be wrong. For with hot water bottles, the potential for burns and scalding seems unlimited. As the cost-ofliving crisis has driven more people to use them for

warmth, so have the number of accidental burns and scalds soared, especially among pensioners. There are an estimated 10 million hot water bottles in use in the UK, and they are a frequent cause of burns.

During the winter of 2022-23, more than 420 people in the UK ended up in hospital with burns, according to research by doctors at the Royal Devon and Exeter Hospital and Southmead Hospital, in Bristol. This was up from 295 in the winter of 2021-22 – an overall increase of 40 per cent.

The hospital data found nine in 10 cases required surgery, and almost one in five needed skin grafts.

Researchers have said there is a need for "targeted public awareness campaigns to ensure a safe and proper use of these devices."



Buckingham Palace opens its front gates to tourists

Next time you are in London, you can pop into Buckingham Palace. And for the first time, starting this month (January) tourists visiting the iconic building will be welcomed to walk in through the front gates and then proceed across the famous forecourt.

It is part of the King's vision to give people greater access to Buckingham Palace. You can also now book a 90-minute guided tour, from January to May, to have a more in-depth look at the history of the rooms in the East Wing.



Re-apply in 2025 to be included on the St Peter's electoral roll

Every sixth year, churches have to restart their electoral rolls from scratch (as opposed to the usual annual revision). 2025 is one of those years, so from January we're asking churchgoers to re-apply to be included on the St Peter's electoral roll (which has nothing to do with the civic electoral roll required to vote in local and national elections).

Why bother?

1) It helps you – being on the electoral roll guarantees you will be individually prayed for by the staff team on Wednesday mornings. That alone is hopefully incentive enough to bother re-applying!

2) It helps St Peter's – the roll is a register of the lay members of the church entitled to vote at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (our next annual meeting will be 11.30am on 13th April 2025). Anyone wishing to stand for election to the Parochial Church Council (PCC) or Deanery Synod must have had their name entered on the electoral for not less than six months prior to election and be an 'actual communicant'.

3) It helps the wider church – the number of people on the electoral roll is an important factor in determining the number of lay representatives a church has at Deanery Synod, as well as its Parish Share payments to the diocese.

Who can?

Anyone can apply who is resident in the parish (or has habitually attended over the preceding six months), is baptised, 16 or over, a self-declared member of the Church of England (or a church in communion with it) and not ordained.

How can I?

Forms to re-apply will be available in the church from Sunday 5th January. If you wish to be on the electoral roll (again or for the first time), please put a completed form in the box in church, or in a sealed envelope in my pigeon hole. The latest date you can return your form is Sunday 9th March.


