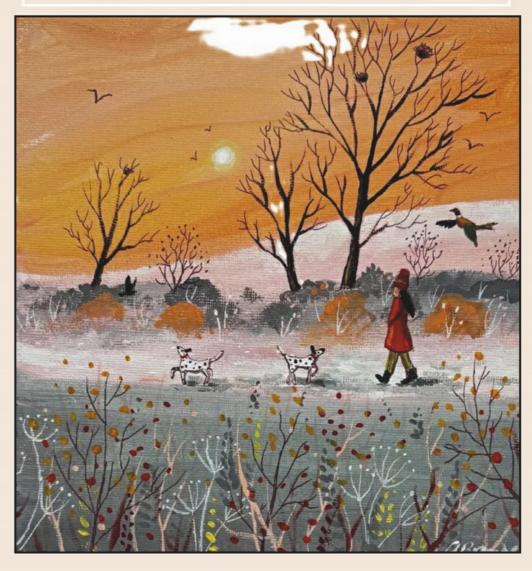

How is your **news anxiety**?

When I bump into fellow dog walkers, the first topic of conversation is of course the weather (naturally, and long may it continue). But increasingly, the next most common topic is how depressing the news is.

The word 'doomscrolling' has been added to many dictionaries in recent years, describing "the tendency to continue to surf or scroll through bad news, even though that news is saddening,

disheartening, or depressing" (Merrian-Webster). Mental health charities highlight the over consumption of bad news as a major cause of modern day anxiety.

Yet, Jesus Christ didn't want his followers to panic about awful news, "You will hear of wars and rumours of wars, but see to it that you are not alarmed" (Matthew 24:6). So what practical wisdom does the Bible give as an antidote to this anxiety? In short, a huge amount. But in an effort to keep things simple, let me just focus on one passage in Philippians and pass on 3 tips:

- 1. Remember,
- 2. Roll, and
- 3. Replace

1. REMEMBER!

Step 1: remember the Lord.

Philippians 4:5 says, "The Lord is near."

Stop and think about that. The Lord is near to his people: right there with you now as you read this! It is incredibly simple, but the moment we start to realise it is true, it becomes absolutely wonderful. When my children have nightmares, they ask me to sit in the chair in the corner of their room. My simple presence can be profoundly calming to them, even though they can't see me and even though the circumstances haven't changed. The same is true of God's presence with us (Isaiah 41:10, Psalm 23:4).

In Bible terms, we should actually swap our fear of life with fear of God. Does God want us to fear? No and yes. The most frequent command in Scripture is "Do not be afraid!" Fear and anxiety are clearly things Jesus has come to release us from, "There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear" (1 John 4:18). But again and again in Scripture we are called to fear God – not in the sense of being afraid of him but rather having an awe, respect and reverence for him. The fact is, the more we fear God in the right sense, the less we will fear what life can throw at us (see Exodus 20:20). So step 1: remember the Lord!

2. ROLL!

Step 2: roll your burdens onto the Lord.

Philippians 4:6-7 says, "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." Prayer punctures anxiety. We are not big enough to carry all the burdens the news cycle places on us. But God is. So "cast [or roll] all your cares onto the Lord for he cares for you" (1 Peter 5:7, Psalm 55:22). We are not just permitted or invited to do so. We are commanded.

When George Müller was asked how he could stay so calm while running numerous nineteenth century orphanages on a shoestring, he replied, "I rolled sixty things onto the Lord this morning." How did he handle the burden of caring for thousands of orphans? He took them off his own shoulders, one by one, and rolled them onto God's in prayer.

So, step 2: roll those burdens!

3. REPLACE!

Step 3: replace bad news with good.

Philippians 4:8 says, "Whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things."

It is right to stay informed, especially if it spurs us on to pray or lobby for change. But there is no moral duty to doomscroll and overfill our minds with all of the worst stories that news editors can find from around the world. We are not selfishly turning a blind eye when we fill our troubled minds with better things.

This could take many forms: a good book, uplifting music, an interesting podcast, a fun hobby, meeting with people, phoning a friend. Ultimately though, the best replacement for bad news is good news – THE good news ('gospel'). If Christ has died for you, then you have everything going for you: forgiveness for the past, friendship with him in the present, and a wonderful hope for the future, that no one can take away.

I recently finished 'Patriot', the memoir of Alexei Navalny, who died in a remote Arctic prison last February serving a 19-year sentence for challenging Putin's corruption. One of the most remarkable aspects of Navalny's diary was his striking lack of fear and worry. The book ends with these words, "Being a believer makes it easier to live your life... Are you a disciple of the religion whose founder sacrificed himself for others, paying the price for their sins? Do you believe in the immortality of the soul and the rest of that cool stuff? If you can honestly say yes, what is there left for you to worry about? Don't worry about the morrow, because the morrow is perfectly capable of taking care of itself."

So there you have it: 1) remember the Lord, 2) roll those burdens, and 3) replace bad news with good. I very much need to practise these myself! If we do, the apostle Paul promises in Philippians 4:9, "Whatever you have learned from me... put it into practice, and the God of peace will be with you."

May you know that peace this February.

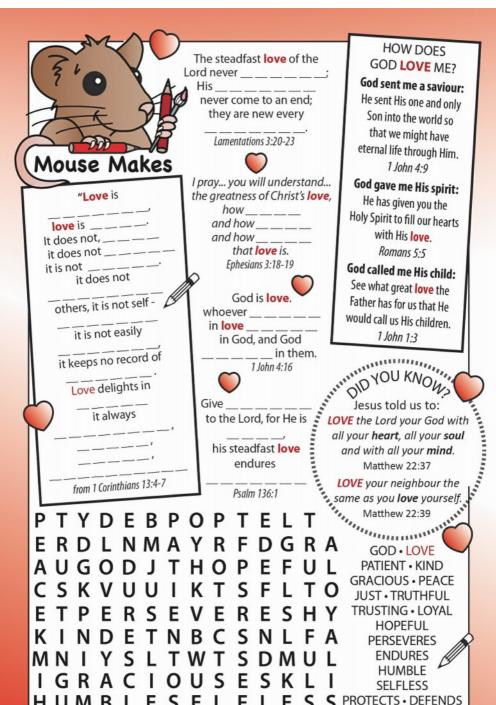

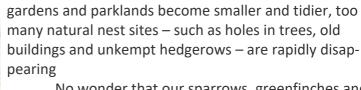

That marmalade colour in cats

It has been a mystery for cat lovers everywhere: what makes some cats ginger?

Now - after 60 years of searching - scientists have good news. They have finally found the chunk of DNA that is responsible. The so-called Garfield gene is Arhaap36.

Arhgap36 has been hiding away on the X chromosome, of which males have one copy while females have two. When the Arghap36 gene is present on a cat's X chromosome, it forces the pigment-making cells in the skin to produce more pheomelanin, leading to the orange morph.

It seems that if a male inherits this gene from either parent, he will be Garfield-ginger, while a female will usually turn calico or tortoise-shell.

This may sound simple, but it took two teams of scientists, one at Stanford University in the US and one at Kyushu University in Japan, to find the Garfield gene independently, thereby solving a 60-year mystery.

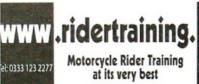
